Tiana Peterson's recent work utilizes the legacy of Frank Lloyd Wright. Re-contextualization of objects and ideas results in visual puns that reference the cultural marketing machinery that has grown around the famous architect's life and work. The works are made from a variety of materials ranging from found objects, photographs, pop-up books, and light boxes. While re-working these materials, she discovers new ways to illuminate Wright's history and legacy while exploring the interplay of art and commodity.

Tiana is originally from Wautoma, Wisconsin. She received her MFA from the School of Visual Arts in Photography, Video, and Related Media in May 2007. She has exhibited in locations such as The Brooklyn Arts Council, Phoenix Gallery, New York, and Artforms Gallery, Miami. Tiana currently lives in Brooklyn, NY and is an instructor in the art departments of Montclair State University and William Paterson University, both of New Jersey.

The Taliesin Artist Residency Program invites experienced visual artists to engage and respond to the unique characteristics of the architectural sites of Taliesin and Taliesin West and their vibrant communities.
